## **Major Trophies**

• Club Champion: Chris Jackson (His first Championship win after staving off a

rampant Scobes who recorded a creditable net 31 in the second round. Jacko's remarkable consistency withstood the challenge)

• Match Play Champion: **Brian Pink** (A big year for Pinky scoring his first two Awards)

• Binningup Open: Ron Allardice (The inaugural and now the latest winner,

notching up his 3<sup>rd</sup> success)

• AGM Winter Trophy: Ron Allardice (Back to the winners list after a 6 year absence)

• Nearest to the Pin Award: **Chris Jackson** (5). That's two in a row.

**Chris Jackson** was the standout with 3. Ronzo (in his short Birdies – individual

season), Tom, Macca, Dennis, Squancey and Walks all hit 1.

Birdies were a bit light on – 9 across 7 players compared with Birdies - total

The par 3 174m 16<sup>th</sup> proved the easiest with 4 birdies. Only the par 5 11<sup>th</sup>, the par 4 15<sup>th</sup> and the par 4, 18<sup>th</sup> proved elusive again! Birdie holes:

Best handicap improvers: **Chris Jackson** – from 11 to 9, his lowest being 7 on 11th

November. Maintained a single figure handicap for 18 of the 23

home-and-away rounds. Honorable mentions to:

Graham McLennan who had a mid-season spurt, tumbling from 17 down to 12 toward the end of December before easing

out to 17 again at season end; and

**Graham Squance** with a similar experience – from 12 to 9 for a 6 week run in November/December before drifting back to 12.

Backward handicap movers: **Robin Dalby** was the star attraction, steadily drifting out from

12 to the club 9-hole maximum of 18 toward the end of February

before closing on 16.

Most notable wins: In a season noted for its modest scores, the most notable wins

were:

Stableford competitions: 1.

> 23 pts – Graham Walker (off a 12 handicap) to win the Wembley Spring Classic. It's becoming a stand-out event with Steve's 25 pts in 2016 and Scobe's 24 points in 2015. Notably, Walks notched up 22 points also at Wembley to win the

Christmas Cup;

43 pts – Ronzo's resounding Winter Trophy record scoring win.

Stroke competitions:

**Ave. Net 34 – In round 1 of the Golden Putter**. All but one of the six players shot sub-par with Chris (Net 32) and

Walks (33) the lowest.

Net 31 – Macca on 28<sup>th</sup> November in a spanking good round, also winning the NTP and Longest Drive,

all this 2 days after his 70<sup>th</sup> birthday!

- Scobes in the second round of the Club Championships to almost steal an improbable win

Most club games played:

The old vets continue to accumulate – **Robin** (383), **Ronzo** (367) and **Macca** (a milestone at 350 games today) were joined this year by **Walks** (311) in a steadily growing 300 club. And Squancey achieved his 150<sup>th</sup> game on 16<sup>th</sup> January – and sealed it with a win!
